Who is ARIN?

Established in December 1997, the American Registry for Internet Numbers (ARIN) is a nonprofit, member-based organization that supports the operation and growth of the Internet. ARIN accomplishes this by carrying out its core service, which is the management and distribution of Internet number resources such as Internet Protocol (IP) addresses and Autonomous System Numbers (ASNs).

ARIN manages these resources within its service region, which is comprised of Canada, the United States, and many Caribbean and North Atlantic islands. ARIN also coordinates policy development by the community and advances the Internet through informational outreach.

What is ARIN 52?

ARIN holds biannual, hybrid Public Policy and Members Meetings in the second and fourth quarters in various locations throughout the ARIN region and virtually via Zoom. ARIN meetings provide an opportunity for the entire Internet community to engage in policy discussions, network with colleagues, and attend workshops and tutorials. All interested individuals are welcome to attend the Public Policy and Members Meetings.

In order to maintain the transparency of the ARIN Policy Development Process, we publish a full listing of all registrants, attendees, and remote participants, with the exception of staff of associated support vendors. ARIN 52 is being held in San Diego, California, on 19-20 October, and we hope to see you there either in person or virtually.

What is Internet number resource policy?

The ARIN community decides how ARIN will manage and administer Internet number resources. These community decisions are recorded as policies. The ARIN Policy Development Process (PDP) is the process by which all policies governing the management of Internet number resources in the ARIN region are developed by and for the ARIN community.

Policy development is an open and transparent process. Anyone may participate in the process. A prior relationship as an ARIN member or customer is not a requirement, nor is it a requirement for a person to become a member.



THE POLICY PROCESS

Policy Proposal

An idea for a policy that is submitted to the Policy Development Process (PDP).

A Policy Proposal that is complete and in scope for the PDP is accepted by the Advisory Council and becomes a Draft Policy.

Recommended Draft Policy

A Recommended Draft Policy is the result of a Draft Policy being fully developed. A Draft Policy becomes a Recommended Draft Policy once the Advisory Council believes with a high likelihood that the Draft Policy satisfies ARIN's Principles of Internet Number Resource Policy. Recommended Draft Policies must undergo community consultation and a "Last Call" period before being considered for adoption.

Adopted Policy

Applicy that has been adopted by the ARIN Board of Trustees. Adopted Policies are added into ARIN's Number Resource Policy Manual (NRPM).

FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM
