- prop-155: IPv6 PI assignment for associate members
 - Easier access to /48 assignments (with conditions)
 - Endorsed by APNIC EC: IPv6 PI assignments under this policy will be considered as non-chargeable resources (as expected)
- Withdrawn or Abandoned
 - prop-152: Reduce the IPv4 delegation from /23 to /24
 - prop-153: Proposed changes to PDP



APNIC 57



- prop-154: IPv4 assignments for IXPs
 - Change the default size of IPv4 assignments for IXPs from /23 to /26, and maximum size to /22
 - Resources assigned under this policy will be non-transferable.
- prop-156: Temporary IP resources
 - To reserve a /21 IPv4 from the non-103/8 pool, as well as a /29 IPv6 and eight ASNs
 - For delegation to events such as conferences and any other reason deemed appropriate
- No consensus
 - prop-157: Temporary IPv4 transfers
 - prop-158: IPv6 auto-allocation for each IPv4 request




