






Resource Delegations – IPv6






Address Space Delegated – IPv6






Resource Delegations – IPv4






Resource Delegations - ASN








Inter-RIR transfers






Outgoing Inter-RIR transfers




Historical Resource Transition – wrap up

- Resolution 2021-09: RESOLVES that all historical resource holders will need to become, or remain, a Member or Non-Member of APNIC on and from 1 January 2023, in order to continue to receive registry services from APNIC.
- prop-147: Historical Resources Management: Reserved historical resources can be claimed by the custodians within 12 months of the date they were marked as reserved. After 12 months, these resources will be placed in the free pool for re-delegation.

IPv4 Pool

- APNIC's available IPv4 space increased by 1,526,016 addresses (5,961 x /24s)
- Total available: 13,435 /24's
- Average delegation per month: 217 /24's
- Months remaining: 61.70







Leadership Transition: Stability & Continuity






In alignment with the organization's **Succession Plan**, the Board has appointed Ernesto Majó as the new CEO.






Member Satisfaction Survey 2024: Key Insights & Trends

Quarterly surveys: achieving an average satisfaction rate of 95%.






Ensuring Accuracy and Compliance



- We will conduct in-depth Registry accuracy investigations and more extensive (automated) sanctions screening
- In the RIPE Database, we will phase out MD5 hashed passwords and offer API keys for better security
- Organisation-wide, we are implementing international compliance standards like the ISO 27001 series and carrying out ISAE 3000 audits


- As a number of our services have a large amount of historical data, we need a more cost-effective data storage solution



Strengthening the RIPE Community and RIR System



- We offer online learning through our webinars and the RIPE NCC Academy, as well as in-person training courses and certification through RIPE NCC Certified Professionals exams
- We support community initiatives including NOGs and hackathons and do outreach for academics through programmes like RACI
- We are working with the NRO on a review of the ICP-2 document ("Criteria for Establishment of New Regional Internet Registries") to increase the resilience of the RIR system
- We will also represent the technical community in important upcoming Internet governance events like the IGF and WSIS+20

- Exploring how we can overcome bank limitations to receiving funds from members in certain countries owing to OFAC sanctions
- The establishment of a legal entity in Dubai (RIPE NCC Middle East FZ-LLC) to enhance our presence in the region and better serve our members
- Generate 600 kEUR in sponsorship for events and data services
