2009-4 - Summary

- Requestors who qualify for IPv4 address space may place binding "bids" for the approved address space.
- ARIN can offer financial incentives to organizations to return unused or unneeded address
- Policy takes effect upon exhaustion of the IANA /8 free pool.

2009-4 - Staff Assessment

Legal: Liability Risk? "Nothing in ARIN's Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws prevents ARIN from implementing this policy. However, this policy Yes would represent a major shift in ARIN's activities by requiring ARIN to build business capabilities and undertake legal risks quite different from ARIN's existing business and expertise." Staff Comments: Issues/Concerns? - What if the requester doesn't pay? Yes - "Cost recovery" should be clearly defined. - Out of region bidders? Staff Implementation: Resource Impact? - Guidelines, training, tracking system, reporting system, Significant business model and registration procedures changes, and increased fees. – 18 person months
