2009-3 - Summary

- RIRs would return IPv4 space to IANA
 - Legacy space mandatory
 - Space allocated or assigned prior to the creation of the RIR
 - Other space optional
- New IANA to RIR IPv4 allocation policy
 - 1/10th of the free pool every 6 months
 - IPv4 /24 minimum allocation
 - 6 month periods begin 1 March and 1 September

2009-3 - Staff Assessment

Legal: Liability Risk? "This proposed policy would establish a different political and not needs based method for allocating returned space The proposed policy undermines the legal rationale for distribution."	Yes
Staff Comments: Issues/Concerns? - The majority of legacy space is in the ARIN region. The ARIN region will incur a net loss.	Yes
Staff Implementation: Resource Impact? - Guidelines, training, registration procedures (customers and IANA) - 3 person months	Minimal


