

ARIN AC Wait List Policy Recommendation

<u>Advisory Council Recommendation Regarding NRPM 4.1.8.</u> <u>Unmet Requests</u>

- After Board suspension of the issuance portion of NRPM 4.1.8, the AC proposed policy to address concern - policy text (but not intent) was updated after ARIN staff and legal review
- Revised text approved by the ARIN AC on 16 May 2019
- 14 day consultation period on PPML ended 7 June 2019
- PDP section 10.2 requirements have been fulfilled
- Significant attributes of the proposed policy
 - Resumes ARIN Waiting List issuance
 - Establishes a maximum request size of /22
 - Organizations requesting issuance cannot already have more than a /20 of total IPv4 address
 - Waiting list space issued will not eligible for transfer for a period of 60 months



PPML Consultation

Post PPML discussion, we polled the following questions –

- Are you in favor of ARIN making the policy change specified in the revised "Advisory Council Recommendation Regarding NRPM 4.1.8. Unmet Requests" ?
- 2. If you are not supportive of ARIN making the change specified in the revised "Advisory Council Recommendation Regarding NRPM 4.1.8. Unmet Requests", is there any modification to the proposed policy change that would enable you to support it?

23 participants in favor, 5 opposed. Major opposition points:

- /22 is too small of max issuance size and/or 60 months too long for transfer restriction – fix before resuming wait list issuance
- Don't resume put returned/revoked resources to market instead (\$ received to reduce fees or give back to members)
- Don't resume put returned/revoked resources into the NRPM 4.10 pool (IPv6 Transition)



Wait List Status

- A assessment of current inventory for distribution suggests that upon Board approval, it is estimated that we would fill approximately 250 of the 360+ requests on the waiting list.
- Note that 37 requests on waiting lists would be eliminated due to "having over a /20 aggregate already issued"
- Total space to be issued (fulfilling approx. 250 requests) after reactivation of waiting list policy would be approximately equivalent 150.160 IPv4 addresses



Recommendation

 The ARIN Board of Trustees should accept the Advisory Council's recommendation to replace the Number Resource Policy Manual Section 4.1.8 as proposed; and, reinstate the full operation of the Number Resource Policy Manual Sections 4.1.8, 4.1.8.1, and 4.1.8.2.
