Transfers to Specified Recipients within the ARIN Region (NRPM 8.3) may now be requested within ARIN Online. To request a transfer, log into your ARIN Online account and select TRANSFER RESOURCES on the left. Transfers Due to Mergers or Acquisitions and Inter-RIR Transfers will be incorporated into ARIN Online in future releases.

IPv4 address space and Autonomous System Numbers (ASNs) issued by ARIN or its predecessors may only be transferred to another organization when:

- > An organization acquires the assets that are using IPv4 addresses and/or ASNs in a currently operating network via a merger, acquisition, or similar transaction
- > An organization with unused IPv4 address space or an ASN releases it to a specified recipient who qualifies for it under current ARIN policy

Transfer requests must meet the requirements of ARIN transfer policies in order to receive approval. For basic information about the steps required to complete a transfer, please see ARIN's Quick Guide to Transfers.

OVERVIEW

As part of the process of requesting number resources from ARIN, there is often a need for the organization making the request to supply documentation to demonstrate how the request meets the specific requirements outlined by policy. To help make this process easier, we provide below several types of documentation that may be required along with examples you can download. The examples are not intended to demonstrate how to meet specific policy requirements, but help to show the best format for the documentation to be processed as quickly and efficiently as possible.

The examples are in Microsoft Office formats, but other file formats may be submitted. If you do not have the software that is capable of displaying these formats, it may be necessary to download and install either a "viewer" or other software that is capable of opening these formats. Some possibilities include:

END-USER ASSIGNMENTS

This example demonstrates the type and format of data ARIN is seeking when corresponding with organizations that have made a request for an assignment (also known as an "end-user request"). Requesting organizations should include the utilization information for each previous assignment and a subnet mapping for the requested

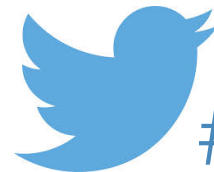
