NEW:

1. Who votes for a member organization ?

- Member organizations now have a Voting Contact (VC) not a Voting “Point of Contact (POC)” that cast their organization’s vote
- Voting Contacts are named by the Admin or tech POC on the organization
- VCs are the designated ARIN Online account user
- ARIN migrated over all existing eligible Voting POCs to VCs – seamless to the user

NEW:

2. Nomination Committee Charter (revised 10 January 2017)

ARIN Board of Trustees slate of candidates:

- "The number of candidates presented by the NomCom shall exceed the number of open positions by at least one (1) candidate, and shall include no more than twice the number of candidates as there are open positions."

was modified to the following:

- "The number of candidates presented by the NomCom for the Board shall
 - include a minimum of one (1) non-incumbent candidates
 - include a maximum of five (5) candidates"

Satisfies ACSP Suggestion 2016.14: Non-Incumbent Board of Trustees Candidate Requirement

2017 CMSSD Work Plan

- **Ongoing IPv6 outreach campaign**
 - Create an IPv6 starter guide
 - Seeking IPv6 deployment case studies
- In development - **new ARIN Meetings video**
- Working with engineering on **requirements for a new “elections system” for 2018**
 - Must support straightforward auditing of results
 - Would like to support current ability to vote for multiple orgs with single ballot cast
- **Website revamp project** with Engineering – starting soon
