APNIC



- <u>prop-116:</u> Prohibit to transfer IPv4 addresses in the final /8 block
 - No transfers of 103 /8 space for five years after allocation
- prop-121: Updating "Initial IPv6 allocation" policy
 - Removes "200 assignments in two years," sets allocations based on network use/structure
- prop-122: Updating "Subsequent IPv6 allocation" policy
 - Applies same allocation basis to subsequent allocations

Items in **bold** have reached consensus and are in Last Call

APNIC



- prop-118: No need policy in APNIC region
 - Would implement RIPE NCC's no need policy (requires 50%/5 years for RIRs w/needs-based)
- <u>prop-119:</u> Temporary transfers
 - Allows custodianship w/registration, guarantees recovery after end date by initial holder
- prop-120: Final /8 pool exhaustion plan
 - Merges the 103 /8 and recovered pools upon an unfulfilled request from the 103/8 pool





- AFPUB-2017-GEN-002-DRAFT-01 <u>AFRINIC Policy Development Process Bis</u>
 - PDP rewrite, focuses on Chair/VC powers/decisions, detaching authors from proposals.
- AFPUB-2017-V4-002-DRAFT-01 Route Aggregation Policy
 - Has AFRINIC issue IPv4 prefixes as aggregates when multiple additional IPv4 allocations are requested
- AFPUB-2017-DNS-001-DRAFT-01 Lame Delegations in AFRINIC reverse DNS
 - Outlines monitoring/reporting/removal procedures for LDs
- AFPUB-2016-V4-003-DRAFT03 <u>IPv4 Resource transfer within the AFRINIC Region</u>
 - Allows for IPv4 address transfers within the AFRINIC service region.

Items in **bold** have been ratified and are pending implementation

AFRINIC (2/2)



- AFPUB-2017-GEN-001-DRAFT-02 Anti-Shutdown-02
 - Puts in place a mechanism for AFRINIC to deny services to (and take back resources from) governments and all their affiliate bodies that have shut down (or caused a denial of) internet services to their people
- AFPUB-2016-GEN-001-DRAFT-04 Internet Number Resources review by AFRINIC
 - Empowers AFRINIC to conduct regular audits on members and allow recovery of resources that fail such an audit
- AFPUB-2016-V4-001-DRAFT-05 IPv4 Soft Landing BIS
 - Replacement of current IPv4 soft landing policy, and mainly sets max alloc size to /18, limits (max) allocation frequency to once every 2 years and reserves a /12 to facilitate IPv6 deployment.

LACNIC



- LAC-2017-2: One-way interregional transfers to LACNIC
 - Allows IPv4 transfers from the other regions towards the LACNIC region
- LAC-2017-6: Modify the Resource Recovery Process
 - Adds intermediate step between publishing the resources to be recovered and recovery
- LAC-2017-7: Reducing the last-call-for-comments period in LACNIC's Policy Development Process.
 - Reduces the time assigned to the last-call-for-comments period. (45 > 30 days)

LACNIC



- LAC-2017-8: MODIFYING INITIAL IPv6 ALLOCATIONS TO END USERS
 - Allows end users to rectify their IPv6 assignment by requesting (once) a larger block based on a new addressing plan
- LAC-2017-9: Modifying "Subsequent Allocation" for IPv6
 - Sets subsequent allocation requirements based on network use/structure (no 2year)

Items in **bold** have reached consensus and are in Last Call

RIPE NCC



- 2016-04, "IPv6 Sub-assignment Clarification"
 - Redefines "sub-assignments" for IPv6 assignments as /64 or shorter
- 2017-02, "Regular abuse-c Validation"
 - Outlines annual abuse contact validation with a two week response window before invalidating
- 2017-03, "Reducing Initial IPv4 Allocation, Aiming to Preserve a Minimum of IPv4 Space for Newcomers"
 - Reduces initial IPv4 allocations from a /22 to a /24 with no subsequent allocations

Item in **bold** has passed through initial discussion and are in the comment and review phase
