# The Advisory Council...



- Works with proposal authors to ensure that they have valid problem statements and are within the scope of ARIN's Policy Development Process (PDP)
- Develops Draft Policies by gathering input and presenting them as works in progress to the community
- Recommends Draft Policies that are:
  - Fair and impartial
  - Technically sound
  - Supported by the community
- Initiates Last Call and reviews final comments
- Recommends to the Board of Trustees for adoption

# Policy Activity since ARIN 41



- **Sent to the Board of Trustees for adoption (nearly all implemented in July):**
  - ARIN-2017-3: Update to NRPM 3.6: Annual Whois POC Validation
  - ARIN-2017-8: Amend Community Networks
  - ARIN-2017-10: Repeal of Immediate Need for IPv4 Address Space (NRPM Section 4.2.1.6)
  - ARIN-2017-12: Require New POC Validation Upon Reassignment
    - Remanded at the 31 July Board meeting
  - ARIN-2017-13: Remove ARIN Review Requirements for Large IPv4 Reassignments/Reallocations
- **Abandoned**
  - Draft Policy ARIN-2017-9: Clarification of Initial Block Size for IPv4 ISP Transfers
    - Abandoned in favor of continuing work on Draft Policy ARIN-2018-2.

# New Proposals since ARIN 41



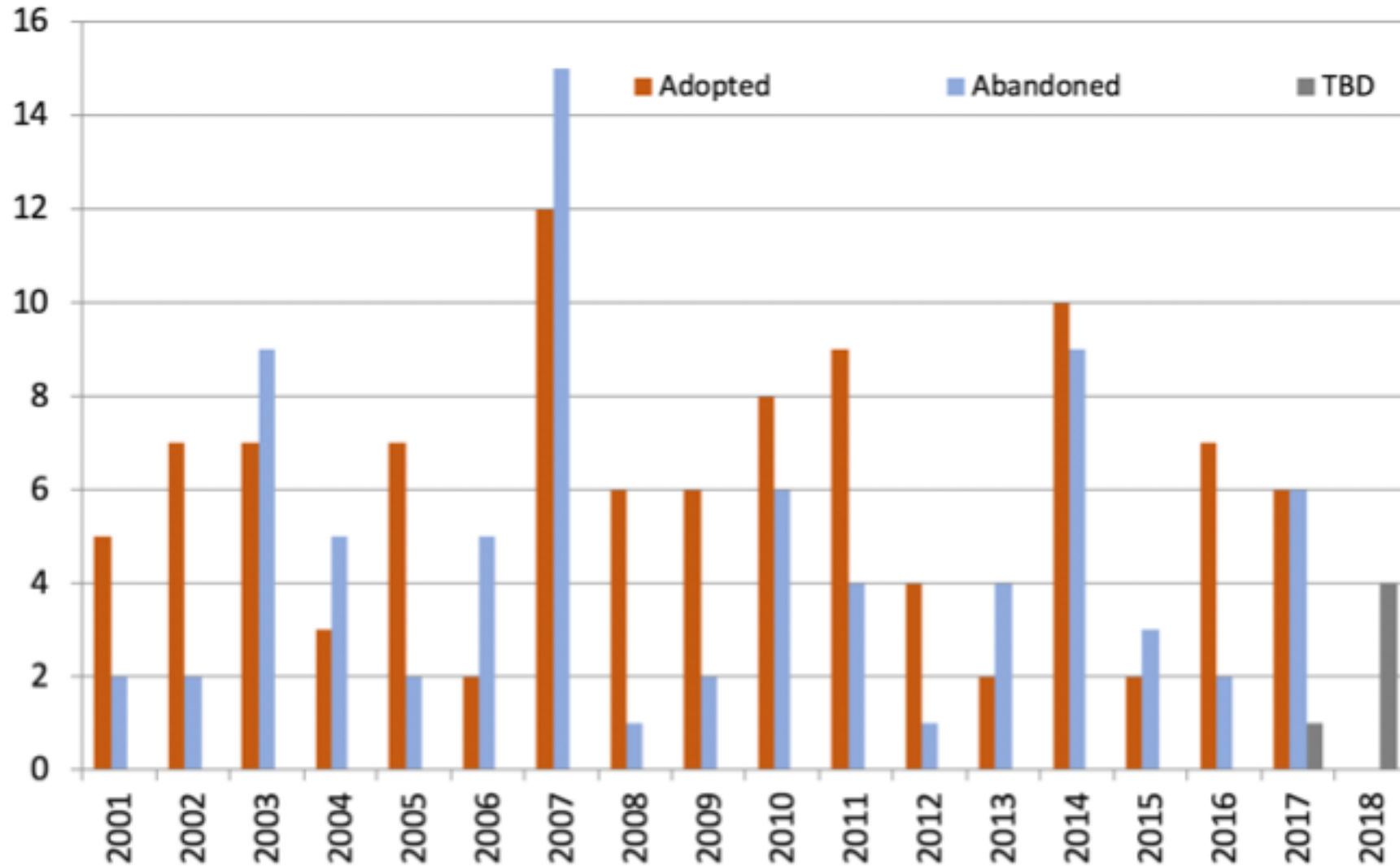
- ARIN-prop-256: *Modify 8.3 and 8.4 for Clarity*
  - Addresses NRPM section header title-casing and collapsing of consecutive retired sections/subsections
  - Classified as an editorial change at 9/20 meeting
