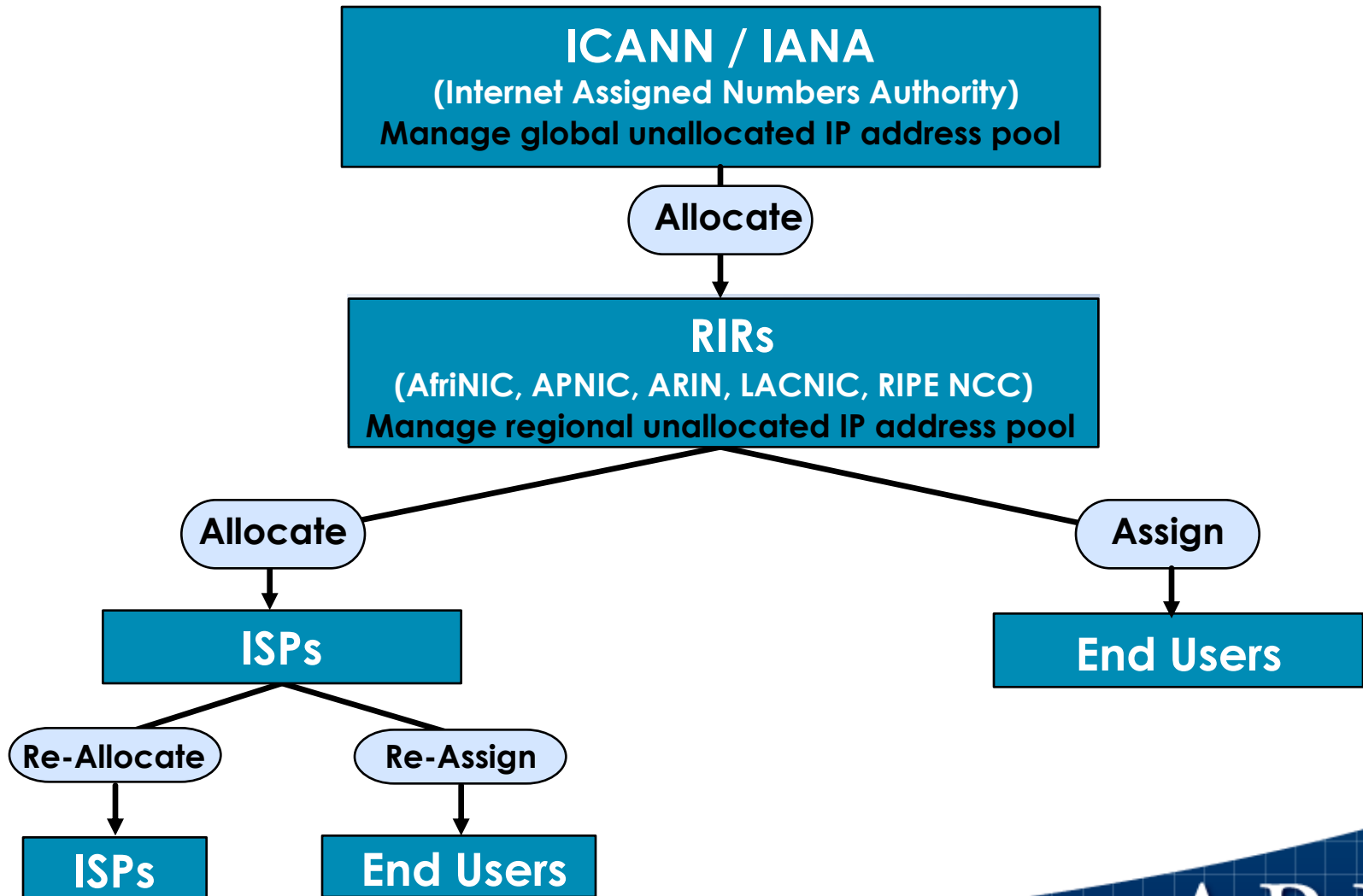
# Regional Internet Registries

- The Regional Internet Registry (RIR) system began in 1992
- There are five RIRs
- All RIRs are nonprofit, community-driven organizations
- RIRs coordinate closely with IANA, and are part of the Internet Registry System

# Internet Registry System

<b>ICANN (IANA)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Top level coordination of the Internet identifiers (domain names, numbers)</li><li>• Manage global unallocated IP address pool<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- <b>Allocate number resources to RIRs</b></li></ul></li></ul>
<b>RIR</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Manage regional unallocated IP address pool<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- <b>Allocate number resources to ISPs/LIRs</b></li><li>- <b>Assign number resources to End-users</b></li></ul></li></ul>
<b>ISP/LIR</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Manage local IP address pool for use by customers and for infrastructure<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- <b>Allocate number resources to ISPs</b></li><li>- <b>Assign number resources to End-users</b></li></ul></li></ul>

ARIN's region includes Canada, many Caribbean and North Atlantic islands, and the United States.

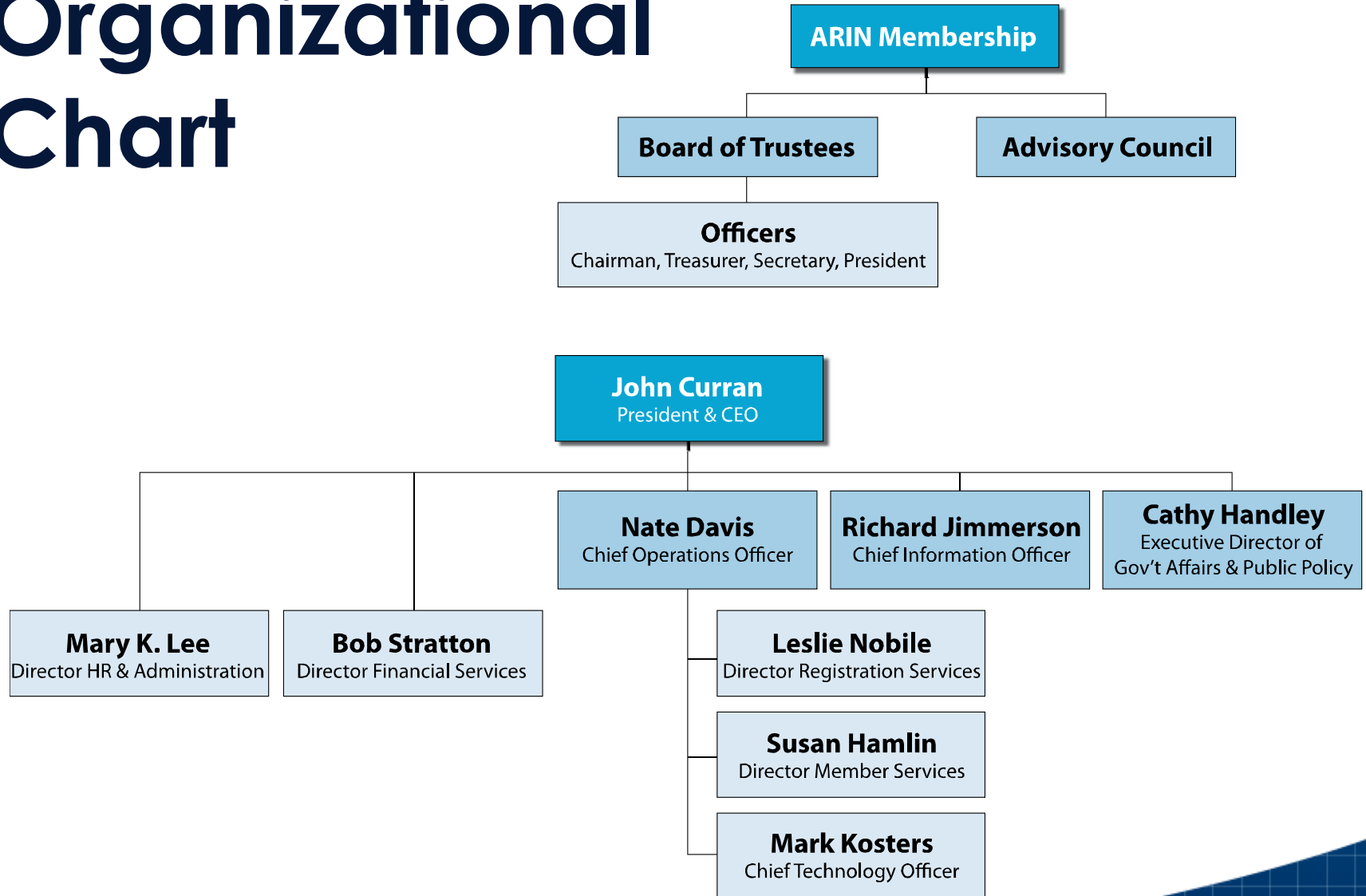
# ARIN's Mission
