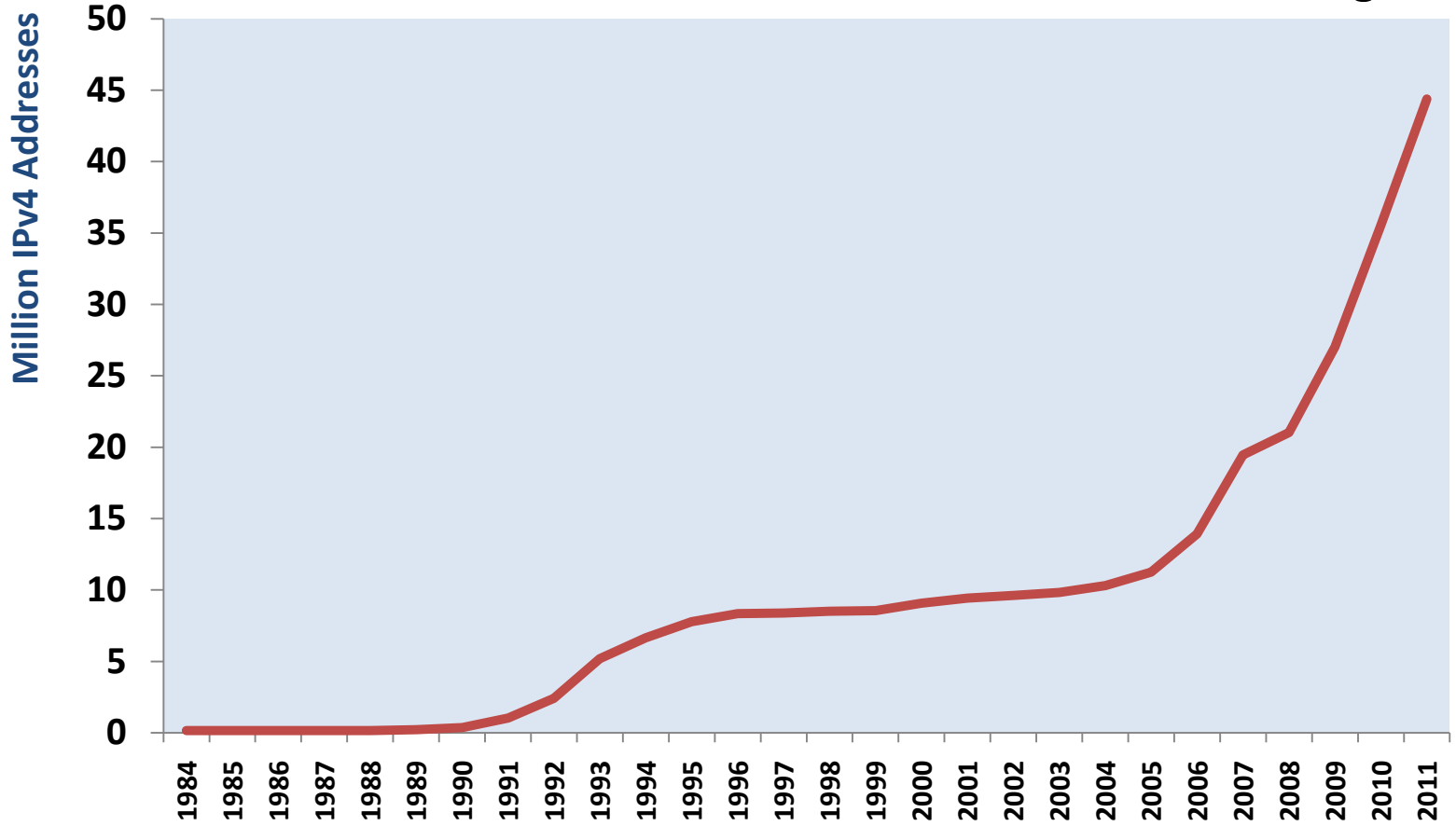

### Total Number of IPv4 Addresses issued in the region

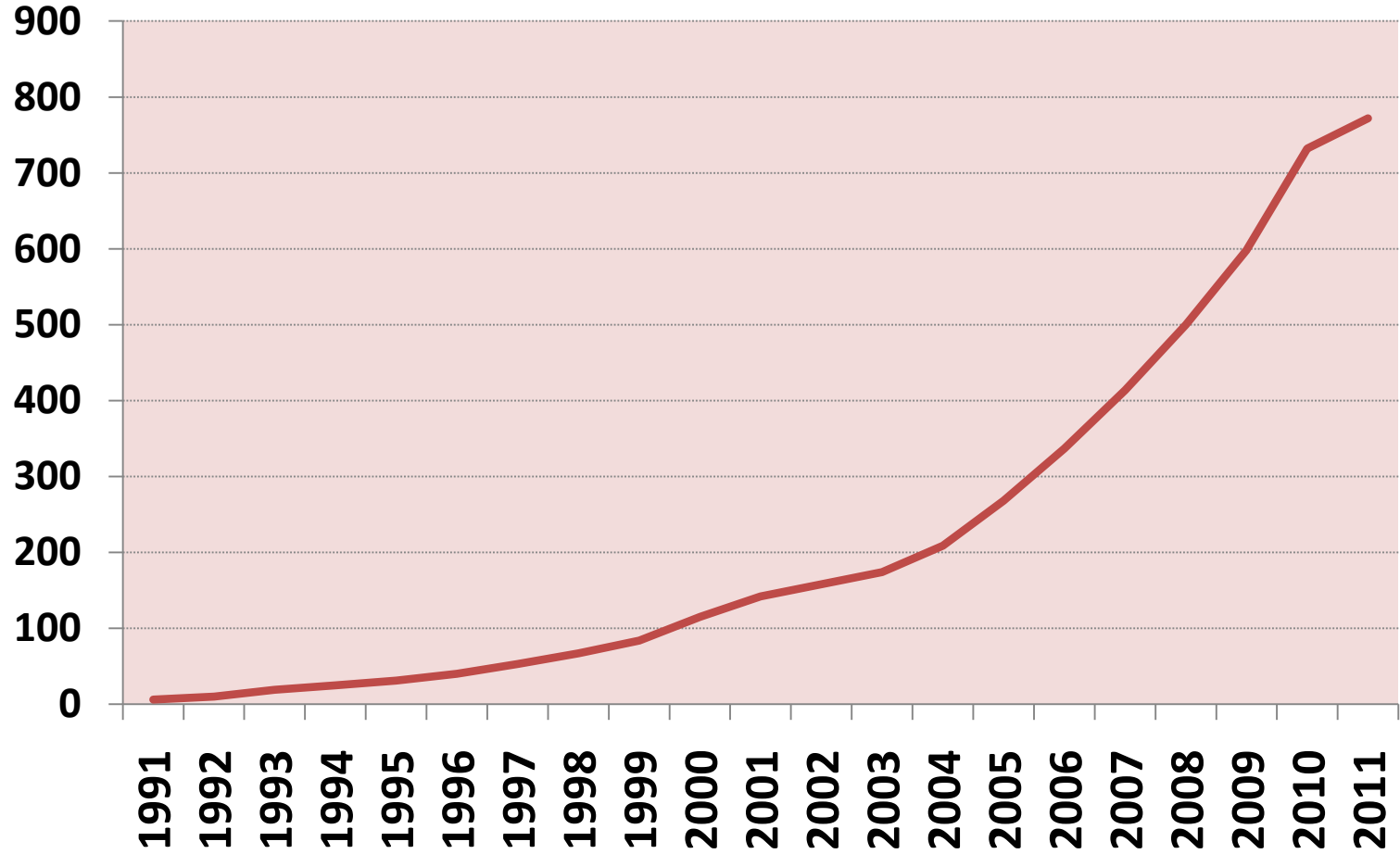

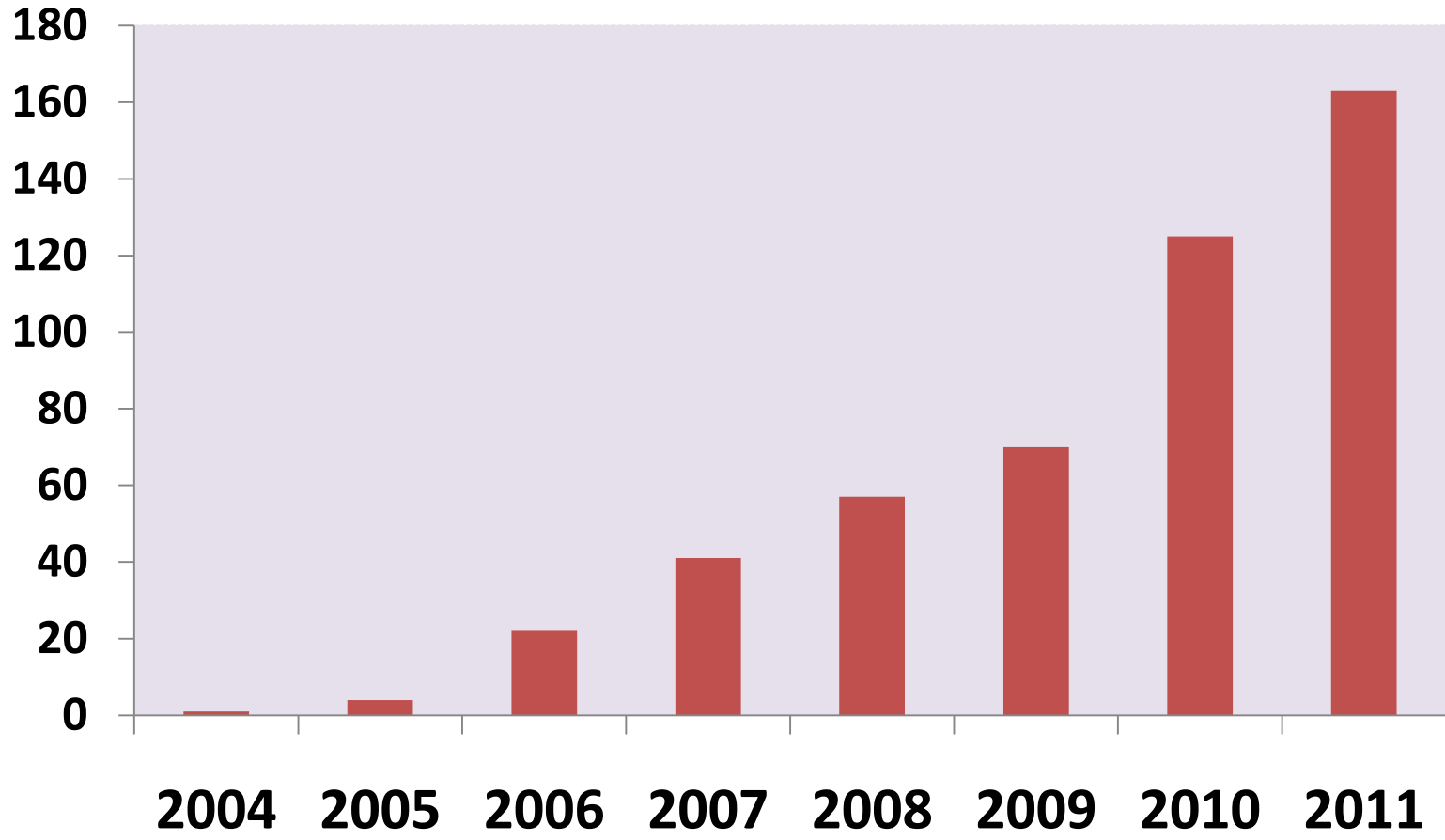

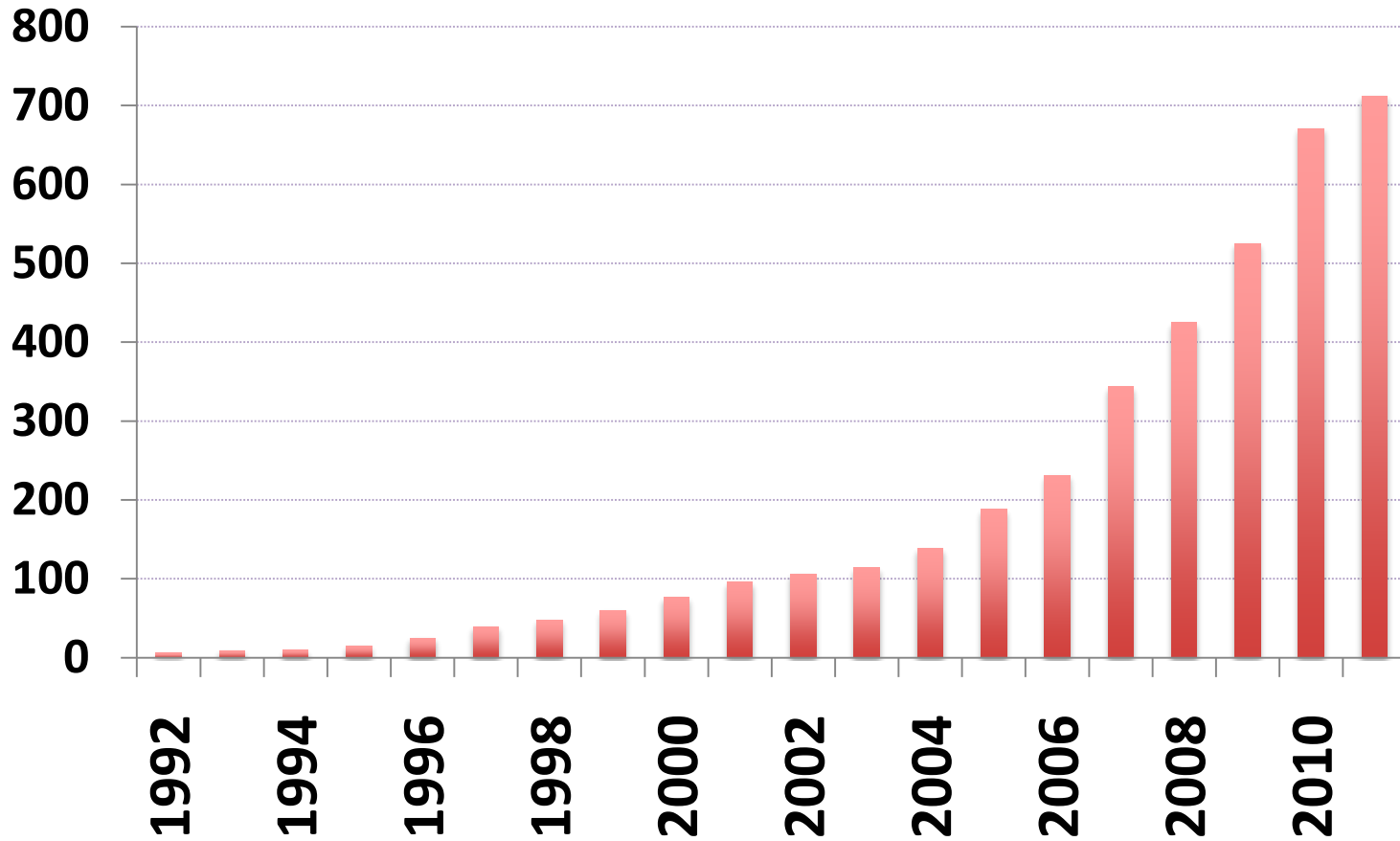
# Membership Growth



# IPv6 Allocation Growth

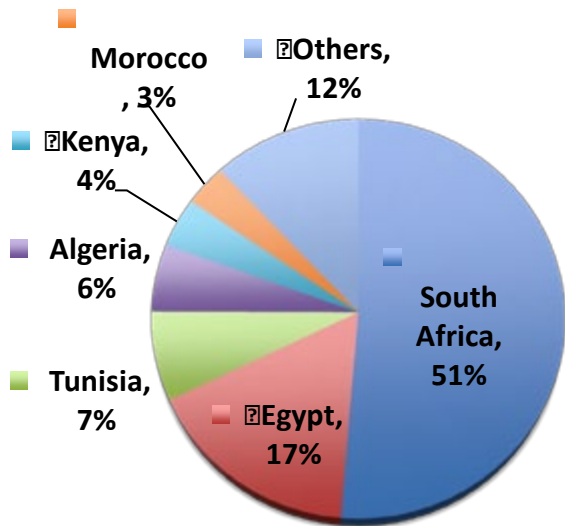

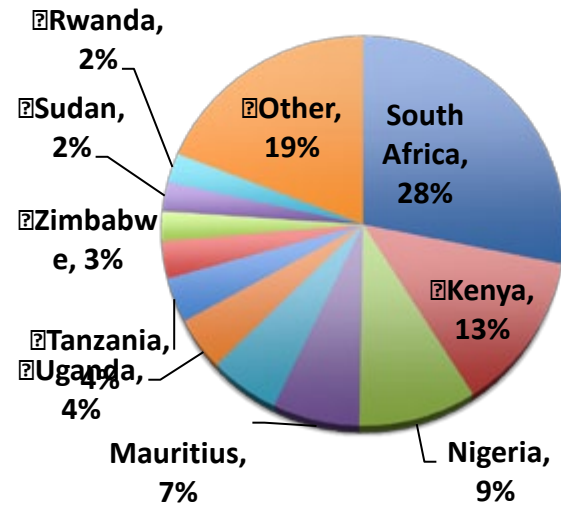


# Resource Distribution by Country

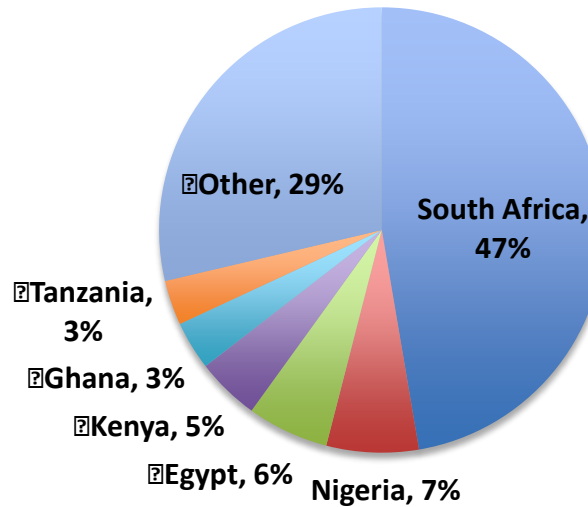

- Signed MoU with CTO:
  - Collaborate on actions promoting ICT4D.
